- Project Lunenburg and the

- The Planning Advisory Committee held a Public Participation Meeting on November 24th regarding a proposed amendment to the Municipal Planning Strategy and Land Use Bylaw to enable a development agreement process for considering increases to maximum lot areas on a case-by-case basis. The item has been forwarded to Council for consideration at their December 14th meeting for first reading and scheduling of a Public Hearing.
- Deputy Mayor: Councillor Peter Mosher has been selected by Council for a second year as Deputy Mayor. As the longest-serving member of Council, his perspective is valued and appreciated in this role.

- With the retirement of long-time Chief Administrative Officer Bea Renton earlier this month, the Town has been fortunate to secure an Interim CAO in Kevin Malloy. Kevin retired as the CAO of the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg in 2019, and was previously CEO of Housing Nova Scotia and Deputy Minister of Service Nova Scotia and Municipal Relations. Lunenburg is in good hands as Town Council completes the recruitment process for a permanent CAO.
- The Town raised the **Transgender flag** this month in honour of Transgender Awareness Week and the November 20th Day of Remembrance. Trans and gender non-conforming people are highly vulnerable to misunderstanding, discrimination, hate and, tragically, violence. I encourage citizens of Lunenburg to take the time to learn about and welcome all members of our increasingly diverse community.

Enjoy the upcoming Christmas festivities this coming weekend (Light Up Lunenburg, November 26-28) and next (Lunenburg Christmas Craft Festival, December 4-5). Eat, drink and be merry – shop local – and enjoy the free Town parking in the month of December.
